Patients and their families will use humour as a coping mechanism, one of them said "if you don't laugh you will cry". Statistically you can claim that it takes 43 muscles to frown and only 17 to smile, I did not realise that I would find so many reasons to smile here.

## **Shop with Wisdom**

What an amazing year 2019 has been for the shops. Our shop teams have grown in volunteers over the year, our donations have been growing and because of this our tills have been ringing! In July we welcomed our third shop just down the road from The Hospice itself in the heart of Rochester High Street. The shop has been a real positive addition and is making a big impact on the money being raised for The Hospice!

Now you may have seen in the shops recently that we stopped selling plastic carrier bags and instead are now offering fully recyclable paper bags. This is just a step in trying to be more environmentally friendly but it doesn't just stop there. Charity shops are able to offer supporters a sustainable and ethical option in donating their pre loved items which stops so much going to landfill. The benefit that you may be surprised to know is that in 2018/19 councils in Britain had to pay £91.35 in landfill tax for every tonne of waste they put into the ground! By reducing this amount of waste, charity shops saved local authorities around £30m in the UK over that time period. This is money they retain to spend on services for local residents instead!





Now having three shops we do try and move stock around if they have not sold in one place after a certain amount of time, (often in the back of my tiny car but a journey that I would have had to make). We also sell unsaleable stock to recycling companies who then go on to sell to the markets abroad, often being Africa. So we do still make money for The Hospice this way but more importantly we are not just sending unsaleable items to landfill. This is clothing, shoes, handbags, CD's & DVD's, books and homeware items, but not forgetting the amount of items that we are able to sell within our shops, giving items a new life.

So remember, if you are in need of a new top or pair of jeans why not take a look in one of our shops first! Not only will you grab a bargain and help a local cause, but you will do your bit for the planet as well!

#### Back in November all our shops paid their tribute to the fallen by dedicating their windows to Remembrance Day.

A special thank you to Rosemary Joyce who volunteers at Chatham. Rosemary had been planning for a whole year by making and installing the shops' display. Rosemary even had a full page in the Kent messenger showing her beautiful display. We are very proud to count her amongst our volunteers.


